








## A Daily Photo Improves Personal Wellbeing

aking a photo each day and posting it online has complex benefits say researchers who say it supports improved wellbeing. A study recorded what photos people took, what text they added and how they interacted with others on the photo-a-day site for two months.

This is a popular social phenomenon, with Instagram having over 1.5million photos tagged #365 for each day of the year while there are thousands of members of Blipfoto, a key photo-a-day site.

A study co-authored by Dr Liz Brewster of Lancaster University and Dr Andrew Cox of the University of Sheffield recorded what photos people took, what text they added and how they interacted with others on the photo-a-day site for two months.

They found that taking a daily photo improved wellbeing through:

- Self-care
- Community interaction
- Potential for reminiscence

Taking a moment to be mindful, and looking for something different or unusual in the day were

seen as positive well-being benefits of the practice.

One participant said: "My job is stressful and just the thought: oh wait a moment, no, I'll stop and take a photograph of this insect sitting on my computer or something. Just taking a moment is very salutary I think."

It also led to more exercise and gave a sense of purpose, competence and achievement.

Another participant said: "It encourages me to get out of the house. I'll think maybe I'll take a walk down on to the sea-front and before I know it I'm two miles along the coast."

Several participants had taken early retirement and found that the contact established via photo-a-day replaced some of the daily office chatter that they missed.

"It could be a rubbish photograph but if somebody commented on it, it made it worthwhile."

The online text was used to provide personal narratives, reminiscences, and explanations of repeated images.

The researchers said the practice is "an active process of meaning making, in which a new conceptualization of well-being emerges."

## Got Good Equipment? Get Good Insurance

Check with your car or home insurance person and ask for a separate policy to cover your cameras and associated gear. Any long-term EPSer will tell you stories about how easily and often odd and unexpected accidents happen out in the field.

Special insurance costs about \$15 per \$1,000 of insured equipment per year. It has no deductible and full value replacement on losses. Finding serial numbers is the hardest part.


## Q & A With Tim Grey





Adobe Camera Raw includes all of the adjustments found in the Develop module in Lightroom. Is there any reason I

should [use] Lightroom rather than relying on Camera Raw?



or Adobe Camera Raw, (ACR) the key difference is [photo organization].

[First], ACR has the same adjustments as the Develop module of LCCC, so no advantage. [Second], features available in LCCC [have no advantage] over using AB and PS, that are usually [used in combination].

The [only] LCCC advantage has is the catalog for managing photos as it works seamlessly across a variety of different folders. Thats why I prefer it.

And, to be sure, if you don't know how LCCC catalog works, you can create a huge mess. But, to avoid a catalog for managing photos, PS certainly provides options suitable for many photographers.

Do you crop incamera or zoom out 5-10% to do the perfect crop (or rotate a few degrees) in [post processing]?

In the real world it can be challenging to get all aspects of a photo perfectly right

in the camera. So, cropping (or overall framing) is the issue.

Many cameras don't include a 100% viewfinder, so the photo you capture will [include] a little more space [beyond] the viewfinder edges.

It can be very helpful to have a little extra room to work with when rotating or, simply wanting to crop the overall image for aesthetic purposes.

If I don't want to waste a lot of time in the [field] trying to make a crop decision, I give a little bit of extra room around the scene so I have more flexibility when cropping later.

It makes perfect sense to include a little bit of extra space especially when using a wide-angle lens and perspective correction will be required. In that situation it can be very important to have a bit more room for cropping.

I just installed the latest version of Lightroom and the Dehaze adjustment has disappeared! What happened?

Rest assured Dehaze is still very much available in Lightroom and Camera Raw, it has

just been moved to a different location. With the latest release of Light-

room Classic CC (and Camera Raw) the Dehaze adjustment has been relocated to the Basic set of adjustments, alongside the Clarity adjustment.

I've actually long hoped that Dehaze would be moved to the same set of adjustments as the Clarity adjustment, since these two adjustments fit into the same general category of effect (at least in my mind). So I'm very happy that Dehaze is now a little more accessible and in a position that I consider to be more logical.

When applying a Dehaze adjustment to an image, I find that often I want to also apply a Clarity adjustment, in order to emphasize some of the finer textures and details in the photo.


